Planning for September

The last few months have highlighted the importance to build resilience in children to help them manage and deal with the unexpected. The ability to deal with change, the unexpected and the skill of building positive social relationships all contribute to the development of resilience. One way school can help children manage change positively and build resilience over time is to mix classes in September. This provides a safe and familiar environment to learn to manage change and the opportunity to form new friendships. Nursery, Reception and Year 1 Children

If your child will be returning to school after 7 or more days out of school for any reason, please contact your child's class teacher **at least 48 hours in advance**. It is necessary for school to prepare individual resources and staffing for every child.

Track and Trace Notifications

Nursery Applications for September 2020

We are still accepting applications for Nursery for next academic year. If you would like an application, please contact the school office.

Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 Children

Please be aware that only children from key worker families in Years 2, 3 and 4 will be able to come to school. Key workers are defined by the government as working in the following sectors:

- Health and Social Care
- Education and Childcare
- Key Public Services (such as running of the justice system, management of the deceased, journalists and religious staff)
- Local and National Government
- Food and Other Necessary Goods (such as hygienic and veterinary goods)
- Public Safety and National Security
- Transport
- Utilities, communication and financial services

Unfortunately, due to constraints on space and staffing, we are unable to take children from Years 2, 3 and 4 whose families do not work in these sectors.

If you do work in one of these sectors and wish for your child to attend school, you will need to provide a letter from your employer confirming that you are a key worker before your child comes in to school. You will also need to book the days you wish your child to attend using the online form which is sent round each week to all confirmed key workers. Children of key workers and vulnerable

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families can still access school and are asked to book in for only the days they will attend. If you book in and your circumstances change, please let us know. Extended day provision can be booked for the children of key workers only and must be booked and paid for 7 days in advance using the usual booking system. Currently extended day is available in the morning and until 4.30pm only.

Short Notice Changes

Please be aware that due to the current situation staffing and access to school can change at very short notice. Any changes will be communicated to parents and carers via email as soon as possible. If you have changed your email contact details, please inform the school office as soon as possible.

FAMILY LOSS DURING SCHOOL CLOSURE

We recognise that many of the negative effects of the changes in our everyday life may have a lasting impact on the children. To enable us to support children who have suffered loss of any sort during school closure please get in touch with the school or send an email explaining your family or child's loss to our school email address dunstable@icknieldlower.bedssch.co.uk There are many types of loss such as the death of an extended family member, a severe illness in the family or loss of a pet. You know your child best. If you think that your child could struggle when they return to school with any type of loss or change, let us know and we will be able to look at ways to support them on their return. Things will not return to 'normal' immediately for the children or the adults when school re-opens, but we will do what we can to prepare children for the new normal.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT AND ADVICE

Families registered for **Free School Meals** through Central Bedfordshire will receive the Government free school meal food vouchers worth £15 per child on a weekly basis, until schools re-open. If you think your family are entitled to Free School Meals including families of children from Reception to Y4, please follow the link below or contact the Central Beds representatives on **0300 300 8306**.

Computer games misuse - It has been brought to our attention that some children play the game 'Roblox' at home. There is a helpful poster attached to this newsletter on advice to parents about Roblox. It suggests it is suitable for children over 7 years old. The internet and social media have changed the way children interact and share their lives, so it is important for parents and carers to have regular conversations with children about what they are sharing online. We know it can be difficult to stay on top of all the different apps and sites that children are using but there are simple things that you can do to make sure your child becomes a 'Good digital citizen' and avoid sharing or saying something that they would later regret.

What to talk about:

- Sometimes people hide behind fake profiles for dishonest reasons
- Agree how your child will respond to requests from people they don't know in real life

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- Never ever to meet up with anyone they don't know in real life

Top tips / tools to use

- Set up safe social media profiles that don't share personal information
- Turn off geo location settings on devices
- Use the strongest privacy settings on social media
